CAUCUS CONNECTION (Newport News)


The Hampton Road Black Caucus (HRBC) hosted its first **Caucus Connection** in Newport News, VA at JT's Bar and Grill on July 22, 2021. Those attending were pleased to hear from Elected members of the City Council, School Boards, and a candidate for the House of Delegates. As questions from the floor were introduced, the meeting became a lively conversation in which all candidates and many members of the audience participated.

HRBC Past Events (continued):

Results of the Police Symposium:

- Earlier this Spring the HRBC sponsored a virtual symposium of Chiefs of Police. There were some eighty community participants. Chief Paul Neudigate of Virginia Beach and Chief of Larry D. Boone of Norfolk were the principal speakers at the symposium. The event began with a presentation by both chiefs on how they saw the role of police in our communities. They also discussed how the role of community policing has evolved in Hampton Roads and how police training and doctrine has grown, compared to other communities in Virginia.
- The symposium was described by attendees as helpful and clarifying, both on the part of the citizens and the police forces represented. The symposium ended with an entreaty by the Chiefs for better and more communication between our respective citizenry and police officers
- **Update:** On the 10th of August, the President of HRBC met with Virginia Beach Chief of Police, Paul Neudigate and his Deputy. Chief Neudigate had spoken of his wish to further community policing in Virginia Beach. The following is a summary of their discussion:

The Chief's goals included:

- a. Focus on Community Engagement. Building a positive relationship between the PD and the community. To facilitate this, the VBPD has established a Community Engagement Officer in each precinct to be a liaison with community members and to aid police/community engagement.
- b. Recruitment. To encourage minority and persons-of-color participation in policing (the VBPD has 100+ vacancies which need to be filled), the Department is going to establish an "apprenticeship" program for youth 18-21 years of age to work with the police force, and, if they find a calling to a police career, they can then attend the VB Police Academy Note: the VB Academy is twice as long as the State-mandated training and the OJT in the field upon graduation is equally extended. The Chief regularly meets with officers of color to invite their input to Command.
- c. Policy Change. The Chief has rewritten the Department policy on the use of CS gas. Less extreme irritants can be used at the discretion of the officers on the scene; however, use of CS gas requires the Chief's explicit order.
- d. Gun Shot Detectors. The city will invest in special sensors that detect gun shots, identify locations, and can have police movement towards "shots fired" within seconds, often minutes before citizens can call for help via 911.
- e. Ride-Alongs. The Chief renewed his invitation for members of the HRBC Board to participate in the "Ride-Along" program to accompany police officers in order to gain an appreciation of Virginia Beach's enforcement challenges.
- <u>Further meetings</u> are envisioned to continue to build a spirit of community participation in which the police and the community work together to reduce the impact of crime within the community.

The Community Action Team of the HRBC (continued from above)

The four areas are: **Transparency** (can the community view the progress of issues and decisions by elected officials), **Timeliness** (response to citizen correspondence), **Advocacy** (speaking to and advocating for community concerns), and **Flexibility** (welcoming of newly activated levels of citizenled political activity).

The above will be accomplished through the use of CAT-Watchdogs (at least two per city) who will attend, monitor, and report on City Council and School Board Meetings. The CAT provides training and guidance. At present, several CAT Watchdogs are at work; however, HRBC still needs Watchdogs in Newport News, Norfolk, Hampton, Chesapeake, and Suffolk.
